

Working Papers



Pennsylvania's Child Labor Law requires a minor between 14 and 17 years of age to obtain working papers before securing a job. For youths to obtain a work permit, their parent or guardian must appear in person before the school authorities to give consent.

To obtain working papers at General McLane, you must first get the application from the main office. A parent/guardian must present a birth

certificate or other acceptable proof of age and the application must be signed in front of a witness. The witness may be an office staff member or they may take it to a notary public to witness.

Once the application has been completely filled out and signed, the student may return it to the main office and a permanent working permit will be issued.
